

BOL OPENS STORE

The Bread of Life Rescue Mission is opening up a Thrift Store to better serve the public with reasonably priced lightly used clothing, household items, furniture, appliances, and many other items including sporting goods, electronics, outdoor equipment, etc.



The new Bread of Life Rescue Mission's Thrift Store is located at 356 West Ave., Crossville, Tn. (The old Marlow Motors building) and will be accepting donations of the above items at a designated, sign directed, drop off location at the store. The hours of operation will be from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday thru Saturday. Wednesday's hours will be from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The phone number is 931-337-0555.

Many volunteers will be needed to help at the new Thrift Store, from sorting and displaying clothing, testing appliances, rearranging furniture, pricing items, cleaning items and store areas, help with pick-ups, helping and directing customers, accepting donations, etc. So, if you are looking to help at this important Christian mission, please call during business hours. Donations of food items will continue to be accepted at The Bread of Life Rescue Mission located at 281 4th St. Food boxes, meals, assistance, and other services will continue at the Mission building.

The programs and services at the Mission have increased dramatically at the Mission since the new building was built a little more than three years ago. Since the Mission does not accept government funds for any of their programs, the new Thrift Store is expected to contribute greatly to those much needed programs and services through the donations of various items that will be sold.

Lowe's Partners with BOL

After several non-profit searches, the Crossville Lowe's Home Improvement store #548, qualified for the Lowe's Hero's grant program, and selected the Bread of Life Rescue Mission to build and remodel their existing playground equipment. Planning sessions began with Lowe's and the BoL in mid June and the project began September 3rd with the help and donation of Jim Whiteaker and his crew (Danny, Bobby and Clyde) to level and rough grade the new privacy fenced area to provide an expanded playground area for both small and large children as well as pouring a 20 X 20 foot cement pad basketball court.

An incredibly persistent Lowe's volunteer group pressed on to complete the project throughout several rainy days. When Roger Britt, Lowe's Assistant Store Manager, scheduled a work day on the playground, both Lowe's men and women volunteers worked tirelessly in the rain and muddy ground. All included were new toddler swing sets and glider, a separated swing set for the older children, a climbing wall attached to the slide equipment with new climbing rungs and rope swings, two small sandboxes with covers, a new 6 X 6 foot covered sand box for the older children, two picnic tables with a 12 X 24 foot canopy for the observant parents to watch the kids. Existing plastic toddler play equipment was cleaned and refurbished in the toddler area that included rubber mulch, and two existing basketball posts with backboards with rims and nets at different heights were erected at the basketball court.

Special thanks to Dean Neely of Neely Lumber for the donation of 2 loads of mulch and 3 loads of wood chips that covered the larger children's play area and the picnic table area. Also, special thanks go out to Non-Lowe's volunteers Pete Fowler, who helped spread the mulch, and Roy Sewell who helped spread the mulch



and countless other construction tasks. BOL Community Resource Manager, Frank Massaro used his trailer and tractor with front end loader, to smooth out and level ground areas and unload the donated mulch. A large flat granite stone, donated by Lowe's, will be engraved by longtime BoL supporter, Larry Doster of Crossville Trophy & Gifts and placed in a strategic place on the playground to acknowledge the Lowe's Hero's project. Other Lowe's Hero's volunteers not pictured above but worked on the playground at different times, included, John Cole, Coleen Whiteaker, Beverly Massaro, Pat Chase, and Ryan Hunter. Gordon Carson and Jim Dunn worked at the Lowe's store and constructed the small sand boxes.

As you can see by reading the above, there was a lot of planning, volunteers, labor and donations that went into completing the much needed playground that will be used strictly by the Bread of Life Rescue Mission resident children as well as those attending the Miracle on 4th St Chapel.

Progress Report at the **BOL MISSION**

Several projects were completed during the year of 2015, and more are planned for this year. We thank everyone who had a part in completing these projects from the donors all over the country and within the community, to the volunteers and staff that provide the necessary programs that help those less fortunate.

During 2015, the Mission served 60,631 meals; gave out 1,738 qualified family food boxes that helped 5,272 people; 4,200 bag lunches for residents to take with them to work; there were 10,045 nights stayed at the Mission, and monetary assistance to 313 families with 1,340 family members that received help with utilities, and housing. With such a large increase in the number of people served, we have a very large need for continued and increased monetary donations. Even the smallest donation can make such a difference in a homeless person's life. Your donation can help provide all the services necessary to operate the Mission, and we thank you for your continued support.

We are always in need of volunteers to help our limited staff with receptionist duties, food pantry work (from unloading deliveries, stocking shelves and preparing food boxes), cleaning the facilities, and just general upkeep duties. Our private, separate room for our dental clinic is supplied with an operating dental chair, x-ray machine, developer, autoclave and sink. All we need now is a volunteer dentist to begin a very basic dental program just for our needy residents.

Another important service we would like to provide to the many supporters of the Bread of Life Rescue Mission, is information about the various upcoming events, important projects to be undertaken, and accomplishments achieved.
